Talk Series on "Railway Digest"

1. External transportation of Hong Kong during wartime from the perspective of the Kowloon-Canton Railway

The talk will offer a glimpse of the external transportation of Hong Kong during the War of Resistance against Japanese Aggression and the Pacific War. By focusing on the experiences of the Kowloon-Canton Railway, the talk will also examine the damage and impact of the war on Hong Kong and outline the post-war restoration efforts of the Kowloon-Canton Railway.

2. Operation and Historical Relics of Sha Tau Kok Branch Line

Established in 1912 under the Kowloon-Canton Railway, the Sha Tau Kok Branch Line was a railway linking Fanling and Sha Tau Kok town, and it was closed in 1928 after just over ten years of operation. The talk will explore the background and construction of the branch line and the reasons for its suspension with reference from the relevant historical archives and materials.

Additionally, it will shed light on the extant historical relics and locomotive associated with the branch line.

3. The Past and Present of Kowloon Station and Clock Tower

After the inauguration of the Kowloon-Canton Railway, Tsim Sha Tsui Station originally functioned as the terminus for Kowloon. The construction of the clock tower and the terminus building became the landmarks of Tsim Sha Tsui. Subsequent to the development of Tsim Sha Tsui, the terminus was relocated to Hung Hom in 1975, with only the Clock Tower being preserved. The talk will delve into the impact of the terminus on the development of Kowloon, and provide an overview of the architectural characteristics of both the teminus and the Clock Twon.
